Responsibilities for a Rescue Technician may include, but are not limited to:

- Assists in assessing potential hazards. Ensures that required rescue, safety equipment and PPE is readily available and in good working order
- Performs on-going monitoring of job conditions and equipment resources and reports observations and recommendations to supervisor
- Serves as an attendant, rescue team member or lead rescue technician
- In the event of an emergency, assists in locating the patient, assessing any injuries, packaging for extrication, and removing them from the environment
- Renders first aid and CPR as applicable
- Must be able to tie knots, set up rescue equipment, perform rescue as needed.
- Wears appropriate PPE including head, hand and eye protections, and a harness.
- Follows customer and site requirements. May be required to enter facilities without a cell phone and follow site security requirements.
- Follows handling, inspection, cleaning and preventative maintenance guidelines for all rescue equipment
- Maintains and accurately inventories and documents all rescue and company related equipment
- Assists with special projects as assigned
- May conduct general air quality monitoring
- May be required to work in confined spaces, at heights during extreme cold and hot temperature conditions
- May be required to ascend/descend to heights/depths exceeding 200 feet or greater using stairs, ladder, climbing systems or rappelling
- Must be physically capable of lifting or moving equipment up to 50 pounds and handling patients up to 300 pounds during rescue evolutions
- Able to walk over long distances in full PPE equipment in stable and rough terrain environments
- Able to stand for a prolong periods of time
- Able to kneel, crouch or crawl in internal and external environment
- Have excellent vision and hearing; ability to discern colors
- Must be flexible to work nights and weekends
- Position subject to weekend on call
- Regional or out-of-state travel may be required

- Drive company vehicle and maintain a safe driving record

Responsibilities for a Rope Access Technician may include, but are not limited to:

- Support engineers, façade inspectors, construction trades, maintenance personnel as necessary on rope.
- Utilize rope access techniques for a variety of projects to support client needs I.e. taking photographs, mechanical work, utilizing hand or power tools, etc.
- Set up rope access system to support work at height
- Adhere to all safety protocols and regulations.
- Collaborate with team members to ensure projects are completed efficiently.
- Knowledge of ropes, rigging, anchors, high directional anchoring systems (I.e. Arizona Vortex, SMC/PMI Terradaptor)
- Must be able to tie knots, set up rope access and rescue equipment, perform rescue as needed.
- Perform rope access work at heights, using rope access systems to ascend, descend, and traverse structures.
- Work on construction sites and other industrial settings, following all safety protocols and guidelines.
- Assists in assessing potential hazards. Ensures that required rescue, safety equipment and PPE is readily available and in good working order

- Proboard and/or IFSAC certification in Rope, confined space, trench or other technical rescue disciplines. (Preferred)
- Current First Aid CPR and AED (We will train if not current/certified)
- Current/valid driver's license (May be required)
- Construction Trade (Preferred)
- OSHA 10-hr / 30-hr (Preferred) (We will train if not current/certified)
- Successful completion of drug and background screens
- For rope access technician position, Certified (or willing to get certified) as a Level 1, 2, or 3 Rope Access Technician (SPRAT or IRATA) with a current up to date logbook
